


2023 - SMA SEMINAR: MARITIME ARBITRATION IN NEW YORK

The seminar program is offered to further and promote the fair, just, ethical and cost effective resolution of charter party, bill of lading, and other maritime and commercial disputes by arbitration in New York. Jeffrey Weiss, Esq., Professor of Maritime Law at New York Maritime College, with 36+ years of college and graduate-level teaching experience, will be the lead instructor.

The seminar covers subjects essential to those involved in the arbitration process whether they are arbitrators, participating parties or attorneys. Topics include Arbitration Overview, Commencing the Arbitration, the Federal Arbitration Act (FAA) and SMA Rules, the Arbitration Award, Partial Final Awards, Final Awards, Majority Decisions, Dissenting Opinions, Confirmation, Vacatur and Enforcement of Awards, Panel Member and Ethical Considerations, Discovery in Aid of Arbitration, Hearing Procedures, Security in Aid of an Award, Evidentiary Considerations in Arbitration, the Federal Rules of Evidence, Laches, Time Bar, Defaults, Mediation and Consolidation of Arbitrations.

The Program will be appropriate for both newly-admitted attorneys (transitional) and experienced attorneys (non-transitional) and the complete Program will qualify for 12 CLE credits (12 sessions) in “Areas of Professional Practice”. No credit can be given for partial attendance at a session.

Attorneys from places other than New York State should consult with their appropriate local state authority to determine their entitlement to CLE credits based upon MLAUS CLE certification as an approved provider of CLE credit for the State of New York.

For attendance verification, the instructor will announce CLE codes during each zoom meeting for attendees to include in their attorney affirmations.

CLE financial assistance is available for MLAUS members and New York attorneys whose annual income falls within the current guidelines. THE MEETINGS

The program will consist of four interactive video sessions (via Zoom) of 3 hours with Professor Weiss and the SMA Education Committee. The 12 hours of instruction will be offered on four Fridays starting March 4, 2023. Course materials and outlines will be distributed by internet in advance of each meeting.

The 2021 and 2022 seminars were held online with great success. Participants logged in from Europe, Central America and the East, West and Gulf coasts of the United States. The online format made travel costs and time away from the office unnecessary.

As part of the program, attendees have access to an online library of reference material.
